<u>A Little About Our Programs:</u> Play is very important for children; therefore, our educational programs are play-based. Through play, babies and young children explore and learn to understand the world around them as they come to communicate, discover, imagine, and create. When children play, they are showing what they have learned and what they are trying to understand.

Educators at Numdaji Kwei Children's Centre follow a planning cycle whereby we:

- Observe Children
- Gather meaningful information about children's current knowledge, identity, and culture to assess their learning and progress.
- Interpret learning and set goals for individual and group learning.
- A plan for further learning that supports children as capable, competent people with agency and the ability to make choices and decisions
- Implement planned activities.
- Critically reflect on children's learning and development in a collaborative way with co-workers to affirm practices.

Each room creates a monthly program plan that is displayed for you to view in the room. We love and encourage your feedback and input, so please do so if you can spare a minute. Be sure to also read our Daily Reflections and check your child's individual portfolio to see what significant learning has taken place while at care.

We have had a busy start to the year getting to know the children and families in the caterpillar room, it has been great getting to know the children and establish a relationship with them as well as with Ling.



To create buildings and learn though play with their peers and teachers, learning new ideas every day. The home corner is very popular and the children love to sit while preparing, cooking and presenting many meals to their peers and teachers – this extends to the cubby house in the outdoor environment where creativity is present in all their games.

Animals and their different environments are an interest that we encourage by setting up tables with natural materials, plants and set a scene for the children to explore both with their peers and teachers.

# Kinder Newsletter Term 1 2024

Hello and welcome to Term 1 of 2024,

Butterfly room continues to flourish even at the start of the year. We have already welcomed new friends to the class: Milla, Marlu, Emil, Micali, and Stella had very successful orientations and are settling in really well in the Butterfly room. We allow them time to observe the classroom culture and find like-minded peers who have the same ideas and interests as they do. I am so proud of the older Kinder children who have taken these new peers under their wing! We also welcome their parents and extended family to our community. We ask that you do not hesitate to communicate any ideas or feedback or even questions about your child's learning and development. After all, we work together for your child's success.

We also welcome our new educator in the Kinder room, Seema. She brings with her a wealth of experience and have been actively making connections with the children. This is important in relationship building with each individual child. She also has made really good rapport with the parents too! Seema have begun to introduce Auslan alphabet to the children and these are practiced as a transition strategy. In return, the children have responded well, recalling the beginning letter of their name and showing this in Auslan.

During January, we all took our time in settling in and getting to know our friends once more. Some rituals are continued to be practiced such as our Acknowledgement of Country and recalling the 3 main classroom rules: inside voices, walking feet and packing up when finished. Leading up to Australia Day, we spoke about how Captain James Cook landed his boat, the Endeavour, on Botany Bay and how this had made an impact to all of our lives, especially for the First Nations People. The book, finding our Heart by Thomas Mayo, served as a visual storyline for our Kinder children to understand what happened to the Aboriginal people. Through this, we hope to foster respect and continued reconciliation. To stand in solidarity with our First Nations people, we have the Aboriginal flag proudly displayed outside of the Kinder classroom which the children themselves painted, and the Aboriginal map of Australia in the classroom that shows all the mobs.

For the month of February, the Kinder class are looking forward to three main events: Lunar New Year, Carnivale and Magha Puja day. Once again we ask that if you have any recommendations on how your family celebrates these events, please share this with us... or better yet, come and partake in that activity with us (WWCC is required).

#### Just a few reminders please:

- Kindly provide us with a family photo. If you do not have one printed, simply email it to us and we will print it in the centre.
- Kindly return the completed 2024 Welcome pack. There is helpful information there that helps us create a bespoke program for your child.
- Please return the 3 / 4-year old Kindergarten enrolment form. We need to know who the funded children in our class are as this is a government requirement.

- Please label your child's belongings. Sometimes we have multiples of the same item so it is very difficult to differentiate which one belongs to whom.
- For those whom are toilet training, kindly have lots of spare clothes for them to change into. Yes, toileting accidents will happen and we will continue to support your child through this.
